Grading Policy:

Grades will be based on the total points earned in the following grade categories. The official gradebook will be kept on Infinite Campus. the gradebook on Google Classroom is not official.

- Classwork/Homework (20% of total grade)
 - Includes the quality of responses and effort exerted. Quality will be assessed based on student ability to identify and explain cause and effects, change over time, comparison and contrasts, and analysis of primary source documents.
 - Research Papers/Projects (will count as classwork/homework)
- Quizzes/Exams (60% of total grade)
 - All quizzes and exams will require students to answer multiple-choice questions, written assessments, and structuring of formal essays that will be required on expectations on the AP world history exam.
- Participation/Organization (20% of total grade)
 - Participation includes completion of assignments, contributions to class discussions, promptness, professionalism, and adherences to completing assignments in a timely manner.

Incentives for performance on the AP Exam:

An AP score of:

- 3- will result in course grades lower than a C will be changed to a C
- 4- one semester grade (of students' choice) will be changed to an A
- 5- both semester grades will be changed to an A (if they were originally lower)

Students will acquire the content and historical thinking skills so they will be prepared to succeed on the culminating AP world history exam on Thursday May 16, 2024. If students are unable to attend the exam that day, for whatever reason, it will be up to the student to schedule one of the later test dates offered by the College Board.

Academic Expectations

- Late work is unacceptable and will not be counted.
- Writing for Understanding writing assignments, which ask you to synthesize information from more than one source, write persuasively in defense of a perspective, or respond to and analyze contemporary and historic events, will be assigned regularly.
- **GRAPES**—a form of reading notes that will be assigned 1-2 times per unit. In these assignments, students are to describe Geographical, Religious, Achievements, Politics, Economic activity, and Social structures/rules of a region. For each section, of the notes, students are required to have at least 3 examples with descriptions.
- Attendance is vital. Should you miss class, it is the students responsibility to find out what they missed on Google Classroom. You have the same number of days to turn in work as the number of days for which you had excused absences. *Many activities and experiences cannot be recreated for an individual who misses class. Poor attendance will affect your grade in AP classes!*



- Lying, cheating, plagiarism or any form of dishonesty will not be tolerated and will result in a 0 on that assignment. Second offenses will result in recommendation to be dropped from AP World History.
- **Test corrections** are available for incorrect multiple choice answers only. For each question incorrect, **a 2-sentence response** will be rewarded with receiving half credit back for that answer. The first sentence will tell me the correct answer in a complete sentence, the second sentence should show an example that demonstrates understanding of that correct answer.
