COVID Testing

As a reminder, COVID testing is available on campus every day. Students may report to V-4 (The "Care Room") between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. No appointment or advance registration is required. Food

As a reminder, your student, every student, eats for free! Breakfast is served in the cafeteria at 7:30, and lunch includes nutritious yet delicious offerings!

Food delivery services are not permitted at school. DoorDash, Grubhub, Uber Eats, and others will be refused at the door.

Absences

Remember to call in your student's absence. Do that by dialing (916) 395-5090, extension 506030. Per District policy, an absence caused by any symptom that could potentially be a sign of a COVID infection

will require a negative COVID test before the student may return to campus. I understand that this may create an inconvenience, but it is important that we do each our part to keep our community safe.

If you wish to supply your student's proof of vaccine, you may do that by bringing it to the front office. Vaccine data can be uploaded to Infinite Campus. This may speed your child's return in the event of a contact tracing event.

Chromebooks

Is your student in need of a Chromebook? Chromebooks may be checked out in the library during textbook distribution and in the Counseling Center before or after school.

PSAT/NMSQT/SAT

Drop Off and Pick Up

Drop off and pick up students from the west parking lot (corner of Florin Road and Gloria Drive). Do not utilize the east lot as the new gates are not unlocked from the outside. As a reminder, traffic, especially with the changes recently made on Florin Road, is expected to be heavy. If you want to miss the worst of it, drop off before 7:45 and pick up after 3:45. Alternatively, select a pick-up and drop-off location within walking distance of the school but far enough away to avoid the congestion.

As a reminder, Gloria Drive can be difficult to navigate early in the morning when the sun is low in the sky. Drive carefully, and watch for bicyclists and pedestrians.
